

President's Speech



Today, Forestdale Heights has turned 40. We are celebrating this landmark birthday. From this moment on, we are here to reaffirm its goals and rekindle its ideals and to celebrate all the things that make our lodge great. We are celebrating the extraordinary impact you, our members, have had on our community; through your leadership, of 30 past presidents, the integrity, and dedication of your efforts. Each of you has contributed in a substantial way to the quality of life in our community. Each one of you helped write a chapter in our great history. I am glad to be able to celebrate the collective of 40 years of those who came before me.

We know that our challenges of the future are fearsome, but our strengths are great. We are strong in our conviction and we are passionate, about what we do, how we do it, and more important why we do it.

As we look back on our history, the distant past is often remembered as the “good ole days”, but on a closer, more realistic look, it shows that, from the beginning to this moment in time, Forestdale Heights Lodge evolved, developed, grew and

changed. We have proven for 40 years that we were able to make a difference in our community.

Whenever we were asked to take part in any community volunteer project, Forestdale Heights was there. With people power to execute an event and often enough, with a cheque for funds. We did our fair share of flipping burgers; we marshalled walkers, sprinters and runners on behalf of Terry Fox, Rick Hanson and Israel. We took kids in wheelchairs to hockey games, basketball, baseball, bowling events and even the zoo.

We used to produce a one-page flyer, on a Gestner, then down the way a two page bulletin.

Still later on we produced a four pager called the Horizon, and finally an award winning website, and the present day multi-paged, production called Kol Echad.

We shared in picnics, Purim parties, and collectively acquired salmonella poisoning, which for many members, as I recall, became a personal fundraiser. We did bingos, barbeques, and bowl-a-thons. Our members played baseball, hockey, golf and even the trots. Long before the introduction of women to our lodge, I was told, there were intellectual evenings, dedicated to the study of educational films.

We had events at Banbury, Garnett Williams, and roller-skated at Mutual Arena. We did auctions, car rallies, and scavenger hunts. We were the official falafel makers at Caravan, manned the call centre at the Muscular Dystrophy telethon and went to Waterdown, Woodbine and Rama.

We disco danced at Lulu's of London, square danced at Earl Bales; saw plays, had speakers, and made friendships and fund raised. We supported two developmentally challenged young men to be called to the Torah. The list goes on as a testament to our achievements. I am so very proud to be president of this lodge. You are not only my friends but my extended family.

The world has changed so much in 40 years, since the inception of Forestdale Heights Lodge, but our ideals and values have been constant.

The year was 1967, and it was a time of great celebration. Toronto won the Stanley Cup, that year. That very same year, Jews around the world celebrated the victory of the Six Day War and the reunification of Jerusalem. The barbed wire and concrete barriers, which had divided Jerusalem, were finally torn down, and Israeli law, jurisdiction, and administration were extended to the eastern neighbourhoods of the city. It was a time of celebration when all Jews around the world rejoiced at the victory that was ours in Israel and many of us re-discovered our roots, and Zionism. It was a time of great change.

Forestdale Heights Lodge's future is limited only by our vision and the dreams we dare dream, by our skill and commitment in carrying out those plans, and by our faith. How do we rise from excellence to eminence in all of our core endeavours?

I know, as you do, that the Forestdale family has the wisdom, the spirit of service, and the energy that will be necessary to mount the collective efforts that this moment in our history demands. We can and we must dedicate ourselves, to not only our lodge, Israel and our community, but to our parent organization, B'nai Brith Canada.

I am honoured to have two past presidents of B'nai Brith Canada here this evening to share in our celebration. These are men of character,

determination, great vision and courage to work towards change. Each is committed to bringing back positive, democratic corporate governance to B'nai Brith Canada. These men are an inspiration to all of us. They have never lost the vision and ideals of what it means to be a member of B'nai Brith. On behalf of Forestdale Heights Lodge and myself, we are deeply honoured that you are here to help us celebrate 40 years of people helping people.

Forestdale Heights Lodge is delighted that so many of our past members are here sharing in our *simcha*. I hope that you like what you see and I hope that you will consider coming back to the Forestdale family to rekindle old friendships and partake in the many varied programmes and activities that make us who we are.

We are a vibrant, active lodge made up of dedicated men and women who truly care about their community to make a difference.

In the B'nai Brith extended family, we are enriched this evening by having members from other lodges to join us in celebrating our 40th birthday. We are delighted that the president of Don Mills Lodge, Sheldon Saxe, and other distinguished members of Don Mills Lodge are here with us this evening. We are thrilled to be joined by members of Upper Canada Lodge, Halton/Peel Lodge, Wilson Heights Lodge, and from Montreal's Maple Leaf Lodge.



When the federal government approved the final third of funding for subway expansion into York Region, I was overjoyed. My family and I use the subway as often as possible to get into the city, much preferring it to a car.

For us, this decision is both ethical and practical.

The benefits to the environment are obvious. Subways do not pollute. An extension beyond the border of Toronto allows a greater percent-age of people to leave their cars at home. As a result, air quality and frustration levels should improve.

Upon arrival in the city, there is often very little need for a private vehicle. Congestion on roads in both city and suburb should decrease dramatically. One of the reasons suburbanites have gotten a bad rap is that they are tied to their vehicles. I say, this is purely circumstantial. Once subways are conveniently located outside the city, the public will embrace an alternative to gridlock. In addition, students at York University will finally be connected to the heart of the city.


Eventually, I would love to see new subway lines across Highway 7 and Steeles Avenue, hooking up with an extended line north on Yonge. Shuttle bus service could connect less well-served areas to the suburban

subway stops. Other suburbs could hook up, as well.

Connecting suburbs to a city ensures that the city itself remains vital and dynamic. People are much more likely to visit an efficient city often, especially a city whose air quality is improving. It is a win-win situation for both suburb and city. It is what makes a city world class.

Finally, to be truly great, a city must look beyond its borders for nurturing. This is a very progressive first step in the right direction. The benefits to our environment and health are deliberate, positive side effects.


